Background



- The International GT Open is a new GT series created in 2006 by former sportscars driver Jesús Pareja and GT Sport, organizer since a decade of the Spanish GT and F3 championships
- In only 2 years of existence, the series has experienced a rapid growth in quantity and quality of entries, interest raised and geographical expansion
- Today, the GT Open is a first choice option for many GT teams and drivers



Philosophy



- The GT Open aims at becoming the best platform for GT2 and GT3 pro-am racing
- Key principles of the series are:
 - keep rules simple and stable
 - maintain costs under control
 - visit only top quality circuits
 - revive traditional GT racing spirit
 - provide premium TV/media package



Technical Rules



- The GT Open is aligned with the GT definition and rules of FIA
- Three car classes:

 GTA = GT2 FIA
 GTS = GT3 FIA
 GTB = GTs from Cups and Trophies

 Tyres: Mono-brand (Dunlop)



Sporting Rules



- Events adopt a 2-race format:
 - Pro-Am race (max 65') on Saturday
 - GT Open race (max 45') on Sunday
 - Only exception: Barcelona finale (single race of 2 hrs)
- Levelling of performances ensured by a time handicap system:
 - « penalties » to be served during mandatory pit stop for driver change
- Open to professional and amateur entrants alike GTOPEN

2006/2007 at a glance



- 6 events in 5 countries in 2006:
 - Monza, Magny-Cours, Estoril, Istanbul, Valencia, Barcelona
- 7 events in 5 countries in 2007:
 - Vallelunga, Valencia, Magny-Cours, Oschersleben, Brands Hatch, Monza, Barcelona
- Average number of entries so far:
 - 35 cars per race
- Average number of spectators so far: – 31,000
- Champion 2006:
 - M. Bartyan (I- Playteam Ferrari 430)



2008 Forecast



- Geographical expansion will continue, up to a maximum of 8 events
- GTS and GTB classes to merge
- GT Open race to be split in 2 separate races (GTA and GTS)
- Core group of entrants to stabilize and further improve in level; « national » teams to race only in home races
- Partnership with WTCC to continue in selected events
